Developing children's Jewish identity and improving literacy in Israeli preschools

Our partnership with the Israel Ministry of Education and generous donors ensures that 120,000 children in 4,000 lsraeli preschools receive Sifriyat Pijama books in 2011–2012.

Preschool teachers encourage students to explore their Jewish identity by:

- Introducing Jewish-content Hebrew books in the classroom
- Teaching Jewish values and heritage through the stories
- Gifting a copy of the book to students for their home library
- Encouraging children to share the lessons with their families

PHILANTHROPIC PARTNERS

Recognizing the program's promise to substantially increase youth literacy, the Israel Ministry of Education and other philanthropic partners have joined with Sifriyat Pijama to bring culturally rich books into preschools. Young readers can identify with the Jewish values and Israeli culture featured in the stories.
